


WHAT ARE WE THROWING AWAY?

- Food scraps & leftovers
- Used napkins
- NO PLASTIC or FOIL WRAPPERS!
- NO PLASTIC or STYROFOAM

Computers, Televisions, Phones, Printers, Cords, Lamps, Clocks Anything with a cord or battery








ELECTRONIC WASTE

- Add USEFUL MATERIALS only (i.e no trash)






Illustration MISC Station 2nd floor of Illustration Studio Room #202




Painting MISC Station2nd floor





Mixed Recycling


- Mixed Recycling in the blue bins marked with a recycling symbol

 Found behind the Foundations building in the recycling dumpster




GLASS RECYCLING

- Residence Hall, first floor




COMPOSTING

*Future locations coming soon




FOOD WRAPPER RECYCLING

 Found next to the vending machines in the Residence Hall






ART SUPPLIES RECYCLING

WHAT WE'VE BENWORKING ON:

- Implemented Ripple Glass Recycling
- Cleaned up and organized MISC stations
- Started Food Rescue program for the dining hall
- Hosting a student and faculty e-waste event on Oct 1.
- Composting in the Foundations and Ceramic Buildings
- Zero Waste Recycling Boxes for items that normally would be very difficult to recycle.



WHAT WE HAVE IN STORE:

- Implement more composting across campus
- Reduce waste generated by end of semester move out
- Start a Student Club to establish an eco-culture
- Transition all Waste Bins to be compartmentalized with recycling options
- Work with you all to help bring your eco-ideas to fruition
