Join us **Saturday**, **July 9th** for three special tours of The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art collection, led by KCAI's Art History faculty. We will have a catered lunch on KCAI's campus and meet in Kansas City's Crossroads Arts District for gallery tours.

- ◆ Participants can choose to have dinner on their own, or in Wylie Dining from 5 - 6 p.m. (KCAI staff will provide recommendations for gallery visits and dining options).
- Participants will need to provide their own transportation to and from the Crossroads Arts District.
- The \$150 fee also includes optional housing on Friday & Saturday nights, as well as meal options on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.



Travel Information

- ◆ Program check-in is from 9 a.m. 4 p.m. on Sunday, July 10th (for those not participating in the Pre-Session).
- ◆ Program check-out is from 4 p.m. 10 p.m. on Friday, July 15th.
- ◆ Late program check-out can be arranged on Saturday, July 16th before 9 a.m.

Flights should be booked to the Kansas City International Airport (MCI). MCI is approximately 35 - 45 minutes from the Kansas City Art Institute.

You can book a ride share (Uber or Lyft, approximately \$40 - \$55) or a Super Shuttle (more affordable). https://www.supershuttle.com

Car transportation is friendly depending on your location as we are conveniently accessible to several major highways.

Train travel should be booked through Amtrak to Union Station (KCY). A short Uber or Lyft will be needed to get to campus (approximately \$10).



Note: If you arrive early, you may also visit the world-class museums adjacent to campus before the program begins. The Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art and the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art are free and open on Sunday. Reservations to visit each museum may need to be made ahead of time for safety precautions. What to Bring

On-site laundry is free during your stay; you will need to provide laundry detergent. A convenience store and Whole Foods Market are within walking distance from campus. The nearest superstore is a 15 minute drive from campus.

The Barbara Marshall Residence Hall includes a fitness facility with cardio and weight equipment, a game room, a living room, 24/7 on-site security, and study and gallery areas. Café Nerman and Wylie Dining will be open for meals and coffee during the day throughout your residency.

<u>Check-in begins at 9 a.m. on Sunday, July 10th</u> and you are encouraged to arrive early to get comfortable before our optional campus tours and light dinner. Campus tours will depart at 5 p.m. from the first floor of the Barbara Marshall Residence Hall.

We will provide some materials and supplies for your studio, and we will ask that you provide some of your own supplies as well. KCAI has an art store on campus, and there is also an art store within a short walk from campus.

Course Descriptions

Approachable Printmaking (with Michelle Dreher)

Printmaking is a rewarding medium with endless possibilities for experimentation often leading to pleasantly surprising results. During this class, we focus on two different processes, linocut and silkscreen. First, you will learn carving techniques to create linocuts that can be printed by hand or by using an etching press. Then be introduced to the art of silkscreen printing while discovering how to break down what you draw into translatable graphic elements. Throughout this course, we will learn how to approach these processes in various ways to gain an understanding of how it can be applied to your studio practice as well as how to manipulate the two processes based on your own availability of materials and facilities.

Painting with Native Plants (with Julie Farstad)

In this era of mass extinction, native plants play a vital role in maintaining biodiversity on earth. Artists can help people connect with native plants by showing their dynamic beauty and material richness. In this course, we will make our own inks and watercolors from native plants we find on and near campus. Using these inks and watercolors, we will make works on paper that explore the ways we are individually inspired by these plants, their histories, functions, and forms. Every morning we will start several new batches of inks made from plants we find. Early in the week, we will visit the Anita B Gorman Conservation Discovery Center to observe and photograph the range of native plants from this ecoregion. We will look at how other artists make and use natural inks, as well as how they reference plants in their work. Each student will explore the aspects of native plants that interest them while responding to material and conceptual prompts from the instructor.

Expansive Ceramics (with Elaine Buss)

The focus of this workshop will be to explore basic ceramic skills and simple ways to expand them into larger projects. Our week will start with wheel throwing. We will learn to alter forms through stacking, shaping, and combining. Our approach to hand-building will take the same attitude – how can a simple approach be built upon over several short class periods? We will decorate using underglaze techniques, including paper resist, monoprinting, and layering.

\$45 supply fee (students will be provided a list of additional personal supplies to bring)

Illustration: The Six-Word Memoir (with John Ferry)

Illustration plays a vital role in narrating the editorial of newspapers and magazines, book covers, graphic novels, advertising, and other forms of media or written communication. Illustrators create imagery that provides a visual indicator of what is being communicated from the written word. In this course, we will use a variety of conventional materials to execute thumb-nail ideas, final sketches and a final execution of an illustration that solves the assignment prompt, a six-word memoir. Each student will explore the aspects of illustrating their ideas for a client, to material and conceptual feedback from the instructor who will act as an Art Director.


