We will have a catered lunch on KCAI's campus and meet in Kansas City's Crossroads Arts District for gallery tours.

- Participants will need to provide their own transportation to and from the Crossroads Arts District.
- The \$150 fee also includes optional housing on Friday & Saturday nights, as well as meal options on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.



Travel Information

- ◆ Program check in is from 9 a.m. 4 p.m. on Sunday, July 7th (for those not participating in the Pre-Session).
- ◆ Program check out is from 4 10 p.m. on Friday, July 12th.
- ◆ Late program check out can be arranged on Saturday, July 13th before 9 a.m.

Flights should be booked to the Kansas City International Airport (MCI). MCI is approximately 35 - 45 minutes from the Kansas City Art Institute.

You can book a ride share (Uber or Lyft, approximately \$40 - \$55) or a Super Shuttle (more affordable). https://www.supershuttle.com

Car transportation is friendly depending on your location as we are conveniently accessible to several major highways.

Train travel should be booked through Amtrak to Union Station (KCY). A short Uber or Lyft will be needed to get to campus (approximately \$10).



Note: If you arrive early, you may also visit the world-class museums adjacent to campus before the program begins. The Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art and The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art are free and open on Sunday. Reservations to visit each museum may need to be made ahead of time. What to Bring

On-site laundry is free during your stay; you will need to provide laundry detergent. A convenience store and Whole Foods Market are within walking distance from campus. The nearest superstore is a 15 minute drive from campus.

The Barbara Marshall Residence Hall includes a fitness facility with cardio and weight equipment, a game room, a living room, 24/7 on-site security, and study and gallery areas. Café Nerman and Wylie Dining will be open for meals and coffee during the day throughout your residency.

<u>Check in begins at 9 a.m. on Sunday, July 7th</u> and you are encouraged to arrive early to get comfortable before our optional campus tours and light dinner. Campus tours will depart at 5 p.m. from the first floor of the Barbara Marshall Residence Hall.

We will provide some materials and supplies for your studio, and we will ask that you provide some of your own supplies as well. KCAI has an art store on campus, and there is also an art store within a short walk from campus.

Course Descriptions

FIBER

Hand Stitched: Acts of Decoration + Repair

with Kim Eichler-Messmer, Associate Professor in Fiber

Embroidery and other forms of needle arts are ancient, tactile forms of communication and care. The practice of using a needle and thread to decorate, mend, and reinforce cloth can be traced back thousands of years, with examples found on nearly every continent. While practical and rooted in sustainability, stitching can also be a form of drawing, record-keeping, and storytelling. In this course, we will explore a range of embroidery, applique, and embellishment techniques that span time and place. Each day we will encounter a new form of stitching and learn about the culture and context it emerged from. Emphasis will be placed on learning new skills, but there will also be time for play and more individual explorations of the stitching practices covered.

CERAMICS

Tablescapes

with Elaine Buss, Lecturer in Foundation

In this workshop, students will create tablescapes using both wheel and handbuilding techniques. The table is for food and togetherness; it also serves a multitude of other needs in our lives. It is a site of work, (dis)organization, and an opportunity to display beauty. We will consider the expansive potentials within this space by creating ergonomic coffee mugs, organization trays, vases, salt/pepper shakers, and other devices that amplify the potentials of this domestic plane. Unity between objects will be accomplished through surface design techniques such as underglaze painting, sgraffito, and resists. Demonstrations will emphasize techniques that are transferable to classrooms (especially ones with spatial or time constraints).

PAINTING

Painting as Grounding

with Julie Farstad, Professor in Painting

In our fast-paced lives, we lack time to reconnect with the natural world and feel grounded to the earth. In this course, we will explore the natural sources of our art materials such as water, plants, and rocks. We will make some of our own art materials from their raw sources and look at the ways other artists use handmade materials as well. We will also use many pre-made materials, but learn about their makeup in order to engage in a kind of wonder about the world. For example, how can a drawing made with graphite evoke its origin in a shooting star? How does using a copper based pigment evoke the volcano from which it was formed? How do our art practices and materials engage in a kind of cosmic awe? Students will explore materials that inspire them, bring them awe and help them feel grounded and connected to the larger mystery of life.

PRINTMAKING

Hand Pulled Prints: To Digital and Back

with Miguel Rivera, Associate Professor and Chair of Printmaking

Students throughout the week will explore the use of laser cut plates, hand drawing and print layering approaches as initial states to compare the possibilities of different media. These works will be later digitized (photographed) and will be printed using laser toner prints, altered chemically to be printed in a similar fashion as lithographs (Gum Roll Up Transfer), and direct transfers from laser prints to archival paper. The end products will be a series of intervened drawings with digital tools and a series of traditional prints with manual and digital conception. Though participants will have the opportunity to learn basic tools in the fabrication lab such as plate laser cutting, instruction and guidance will be given in order to make these approaches feasible and accessible to any class with limited equipment and space.


